




Goals:

- ✓ improvement of planning security


Legal character:

- ✓ guideline for state actions
- √ voluntary commitment of all stakeholders

Go for implementation.






IMP proposes about 200 measures

Lessons learned - I.



After 5 years of implementation the most important conclusions are:

- Small-area measures on public ground run well:
 - ✓ Good viability
 - ✓ Less financial effort
 - ✓ Just local effects
 - ✓ Low third party participation





Lessons learned - II.



- Large-scale measures often only run well, if:
 - ✓ Serious political intentions persist
 - √ Impacts as drivers for compensation measures exist
 - ✓ Availability of land is given
 - ✓ other belongings/stake-holders benefit from the measure



Lessons learned - III.



Recipe for sucessfull implementation of measures:

- Have a good hydro-morphological understanding, if regeneration of specific habitats and species is obligate
- Don't shy away from experiments, the learning success is great
- Monitor your results and get the consequences from them
- Size matters: the bigger the scale of the measure the merrier
- Look for win-win-situations
- Always buy private land, for a long term
- Have some measures ready to launch when the window of opportunity occurs
- Share your experiences and knowledge with other groups of players
- Communicate your success to the public
- Have a lot of patience and bring a lot of time
